AP SCHOLAR AWARD WINNERS ANNOUNCED
Eight Recent TVHS Graduates are Named

Elverson, PA – Twin Valley School District (TVSD) officials are pleased to announce that eight recent graduates of the Twin Valley High School (TVHS) have earned the designation of AP Scholar by the College Board in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams.

Sean Goheen and Andrew Guy qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

Lindsey Bitler and Laura Johnson qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

Jeremy Giatras, Sarah Landis, Jeremy Neese, and Samuel Resnek qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams, with grades of 3 or higher.

The aforementioned students took the AP Exams in May, 2007 after completing challenging college-level courses at TVHS.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school, and to receive college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. Approximately 18% of the more than 1.4 million high school students who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to merit the recognition of AP Scholar.

Most of the nation's colleges and universities award credit, advanced placement, or both based on successful performance on the AP Exams. More than 1,400 institutions award a full year's credit (sophomore standing) to students presenting a sufficient number of qualifying grades. In 2007, thirty-seven AP Exams were offered in a wide variety of subject areas, each consisting of multiple-choice and free-response (essay or problem-solving or oral response) questions.
