“OLYMPIANS” SCALE NEW HEIGHTS – OF BOOKS THAT IS
TVMS to Host the Berks County Reading Olympics Competition

Elverson, PA – Twin Valley School District (TVSD) officials are pleased to announce that the Berks County Reading Olympics Competition will be held on Thursday, April 2, 2009, at the Twin Valley Middle School (TVMS) beginning at 4:30 PM. Over 326 students from twelve area school districts including Antietam, Boyertown, Brandywine Heights, Conrad Weiser, Daniel Boone, Fleetwood, Governor Mifflin, Kutztown, Muhlenberg, Oley Valley, Schuylkill Valley, and Twin Valley will participate.

The Reading Olympics is a “College Bowl” style competition, where teams of students compete against each other to answer questions pertaining to books they have read. The students prepare throughout the school year by reading from a list of forty-two books. Each team competes in three questioning rounds by a moderator who asks questions about a particular book. Scorekeepers add the score from all three rounds to determine the winner

“This is an excellent program designed to help children develop a love of reading and learn teamwork and leadership skills,” said Mrs. Susan Moyer, TVMS librarian.

Winners will be announced at the awards ceremony which follows the competition and the Reading Olympics Banner will be presented to the team who earned the highest score. The winning team may display the banner at their school until the next year’s competition. Twin Valley Middle school the current defending champion.

Reading Olympics is an annual event sponsored by the Berks County Librarians Association.
